FAULKNER COUNTY QUORUM COURT  
ORDINANCE 91-33

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO POSSESS PERSONAL PROPERTY WITH A MANUFACTURER'S NUMBER OR OTHER IDENTIFICATION MARK WHICH HAS BEEN REMOVED, DEFACED, MARRED, COVERED, ALTERED OR DESTROYED.

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly possess personal property with a manufacturer's serial number or other identification mark attached in the ordinary course of business which has been removed, defaced, marred, covered, altered, or destroyed.

SECTION 2. "Personal property" shall include, but is not limited to: household appliances, televisions, cameras, jewelry, video cassette recorders/players, microwave ovens, radios, tape players and firearms.

SECTION 3. It is a defense to a prosecution under this section that the person reported such possession to the Sheriff's Office or other governmental agency prior to arrest or the issuance of an arrest warrant or summons.

SECTION 4. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for the first offense, and for any subsequent conviction shall be fined not less than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) or be imprisoned not less than one (1) day nor more than thirty (30) days, or both so fined and imprisoned.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE PROCEDURES FOR THE REDEMPTION OF TAX DELINQUENT LAND NOT TRANSFERRED, TO PROCLAIM AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

SECTION 1. Under the provisions of Arkansas Statutes 26-37-109 the following functional procedures in the redemption of tax delinquent land not transferred to the State of Arkansas are established as follows:


- A. The Faulkner County Collector will collect payments for the redemption of tax delinquent land which has not been transferred to the State.
- B. The Faulkner County Clerk will prepare a certificate of distribution of the amount collected each month and forward such certificate to the Faulkner County Treasurer.
- C. The Faulkner County Treasurer will transfer to the various funds the amounts due from the total amounts collected.


SECTION 2. The procedures in Section 1 above are effective January 1, 1992.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that this ordinance is essential for the efficient collection and distribution of the funds collected for the redemption of tax delinquent lands, therefore an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect on its passage and approval with, however, the actual procedures in Section 1 to be initiated on January 1, 1992.

ORDINANCE 91-49

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE PROCUREMENT OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR THE FAULKNER COUNTY PUBLIC DEFENDER SYSTEM, TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

- SECTION 1:** It is the policy of Faulkner County that we shall negotiate contracts for legal services on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications at a fair and reasonable price and to prohibit the use of competitive bidding for the procurement of professional services. This policy is consistent with ACA 19-11-801.
- SECTION 2:** Any and all firms or individuals which wish to be considered for contracting with the Faulkner County Public Defender System are encouraged to submit a statement of qualifications and performance data to the Faulkner County Judge. The statement and data should be submitted annually from this time forward in accordance with ACA 19-11-802. The County Judge shall evaluate statements and data for the purpose of contracting with a sufficient number of attorneys to provide for the needs of the Faulkner County Public Defender System, subject to budgetary constraints.
- SECTION 3:** The County Judge shall evaluate the qualifications in accordance with ACA 19-11-803 and shall select the number of attorneys required, subject to budgetary constraints. The attorneys selected shall be considered to be the best qualified and capable of performing the desired work.
- SECTION 4:** The County Judge and the selected attorneys shall jointly prepare a detailed, written description of the scope of the proposed services. If the County Judge is unable to negotiate a contract with the selected attorneys, he shall reevaluate the necessary legal services, including the scope and reasonable fee requirements and again compile a list of qualified attorneys and proceed in accordance with ACA 19-11-805.
- SECTION 5:** This ordinance being necessary for the protection and preservation of the public health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and shall take effect upon passage and publication.

ORDINANCE 92-1

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO SET A SPECIAL ELECTION TO SUBMIT FOR THE APPROVAL OF THE ELECTORS OF FAULKNER COUNTY THE LEVY OF A ONE PERCENT (1%) SALES AND USE TAX FOR ONE YEAR FOR THE PURPOSE OF DESIGNING, BUILDING AND EQUIPPING A COUNTY SEAT LIBRARY AND COUNTY LIBRARY BRANCHES.

**SECTION 1:** The levy of a one percent (1%) sales and use tax for one year in Faulkner County, Arkansas, as authorized by Act 885 of 1991 shall be submitted by special election to the qualified electors of Faulkner County, Arkansas for approval or disapproval.

**SECTION 2:** The ballot title to be submitted to the electors of Faulkner County for vote shall be set out as follows:

"FOR ADOPTION OF A ONE PERCENT SALES AND USE TAX TO BE LEVIED FOR NO MORE THAN ONE YEAR WITHIN FAULKNER COUNTY FOR THE DESIGNING, BUILDING AND EQUIPPING OF A COUNTY SEAT LIBRARY AND COUNTY LIBRARY BRANCHES."

"AGAINST ADOPTION OF A ONE PERCENT SALES AND USE TAX TO BE LEVIED FOR NO MORE THAN ONE YEAR WITHIN FAULKNER COUNTY FOR THE DESIGNING, BUILDING AND EQUIPPING OF A COUNTY SEAT LIBRARY AND COUNTY LIBRARY BRANCHES."

**SECTION 3:** Pursuant to ACA 26-74-408 as set forth in Act 885 of 1991, the County shall provide a rebate from the County for taxes collected in excess of Twenty-Five dollars (\$25.00) paid to the County on a single transaction, except that where the tax is collected as the result of the purchase of a new or used motor vehicle, procedures established by ACA 26-52-510 and ACA 26-74-408 (b) as set forth in Act 885 of 1991 shall be followed.

**SECTION 4:** The special election on the said question shall be held Tuesday, the 17th day of March 1992, between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.; and the Faulkner County Election Commission is directed to do all things legally necessary and required under the law to prepare for and set the special election on said question.

**SECTION 5:** The County Clerk of Faulkner County shall forthwith certify a copy of the Ordinance, upon its approval by the Quorum Court, to the Faulkner County Election Commission in order that the question may be timely put on the ballot for such election.

**SECTION 1:** The Faulkner County Personnel Management System is amended to make the following change.

Page 4-2, paragraph 1 D III. Delete the last sentence which reads, "Accumulated compensatory time will not be reimbursed upon resignation or termination."

Page 4-2, paragraph 1 F is added to state: "Any person, including full-time, part-time and temporary employees, who receives a pay check from the Faulkner County Treasurer will submit a Time Sheet (Attachment 1) showing actual hours worked. This Time Sheet will be submitted prior to a payroll check being initiated by the payroll clerk. The Time Sheet will be signed by the employee and his or her supervisor or a person designated by the supervisor to sign the time sheet."

**SECTION 2:** It is hereby found and determined that the effectiveness of the Faulkner County Personnel Management is essential for the operation of Faulkner County government and that any delay in its effectiveness would work irreparable harm upon the proper administration of County government. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.





ORDINANCE 92-4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO SUPERSEDE FAULKNER COUNTY QUORUM COURT ORDINANCES 81-7 (JULY 21, 1981), 82-17 (SEPTEMBER 21, 1982) AND 87-24 (NOVEMBER 18, 1987); TO ESTABLISH A FUND FOR PAYMENT OF DEFENSE COSTS FOR INDIGENTS; TO PRESCRIBE THE METHOD OF RAISING SUCH MONIES; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

SECTION 1: Faulkner County Quorum Court Ordinances 81-7, 82-17 and 87-24 are hereby repealed and replaced with the following guidelines. This is necessary in order to streamline Faulkner County Ordinances and also to bring Ordinances in line with Supreme Court decision (CR 91-60 of 15 July 1991) concerning the cap on Indigent's Attorney fees.

SECTION 2: Under the provisions of Act 979 of 1981, as amended, there is hereby authorized an Indigent's Attorney Fees, Expenses and Cost Fund, which will be used to defray the allowable costs incurred in the defense and trial of indigent persons charges with crimes in Faulkner County or those indigents, in this County, against whom involuntary commitments or alcoholism are sought.

SECTION 3: Effective on passage and approval of this Ordinance, the Clerks of each of the Chancery, Circuit, Probate, Municipal, Justice of the Peace, Traffic, Police and Mayor's Courts within Faulkner County, are authorized and directed to add and collect the sum of \$5.00 to the filing fees and costs of all cases, civil and criminal, filed in these Courts provided, however, no such fee shall be taxed as costs in any action filed in any small claims court.

Fees so collected are to be paid to the Faulkner County Treasurer by the fifth day of the following month and the Treasurer will create and maintain an account with these fees, which will be entitled the Indigents Attorney Fees, Expenses and Cost Fund.

Payments out of the Indigent's Attorney Fees, Expenses and Cost Fund will be for the payment of indigent expenses to include, but not limited to, attorney's fees, expert witness fees and other reasonable necessary costs incurred in the defense and trial of indigent persons in any Court in which the fees listed above are collected. These fees will be used to pay the cost of the Faulkner County Public Defender System as outlined in Faulkner County Ordinance 91-49.

SECTION 4: Attorneys contracted with the Faulkner County Public

Defender System are bound by the provisions of their personal services contracts.

Attorneys appointed outside the Faulkner County Public Defender System are required to keep an accurate, detailed accounting of the amount of time and the nature of their services and expenses for each case, with expenses being defined as meaning any expenditure other than witness fees and investigator fees.

Prior to obtaining the services of any investigator or expert witness, the attorney will secure the written approval of their services and fees from the Court in which the matter is pending.

**SECTION 5:** At the conclusion of the case involving the indigent, the attorney will submit his time and expense schedule along with any expert witness or investigator expenses to the Court having jurisdiction, in order that the order to pay shall reach the County within forty-five (45) days.

**SECTION 6:** This Ordinance having been determined to be necessary for the protection and preservation of public health and safety , an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in force and shall take affect upon passage and publication.

ORDINANCE 92-5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR THE UPGRADING OF EXISTING BRIDGES AND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND ERECTION OF REPLACEMENT AND NEW BRIDGES ON COUNTY ROADS, TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

SECTION 1: After thorough study, it has been determined by the Quorum Court of Faulkner County that the upgrading of existing bridges and the construction and erection of replacement and new bridges on county roads shall meet certain minimum bridge design standards as set forth in Section Two of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: The hydraulic design for bridges shall provide for the twenty-five (25) year flood frequency. Freeboard will be based on the site specific hydrology.

SECTION 3: The exceptions to these minimum standards are:

- a. Bridges being routinely repaired.
- b. Bridges that serve less than ten (10) households on dead end roads or non-thoroughfare roads.
- c. Bridges providing limited access to agricultural fields, pasturelands, oil fields, timberlands, etc.

SECTION 4: The minimum bridge design standards for the upgrading of existing bridges and for the construction and erection of all replacement and new bridges on county roads shall be as follows:


**SECTION 5:** The upgrading of existing bridges and the construction and erection of replacement and new bridges on the county road system shall be subject to and meet the provisions as set forth in Arkansas Code Annotated 12-80-101 through 12-80-106 (Act 1100 of 1991), requiring earthquake resistant design for public structures.

**SECTION 6:** It is hereby found and determined by the Quorum Court of Faulkner County that there is a need to establish minimum standards for the upgrading of existing bridges and for the construction and erection of replacement and new bridges on county roads. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.



**ORDINANCE 92-6**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE ASSESSING A \$4.00 COURT COST TO FUND THE PUBLIC DEFENDER PROGRAM FOR INVESTIGATION EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE OPERATION OF THAT OFFICE, TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**SECTION 1:** Act 692 of 1989 has provided for the assessment of a \$4.00 court cost for the funding of investigation expenses for public defenders in the defense of indigent persons accused of criminal offenses and in the defense of indigent persons against whom involuntary commitment procedures for insanity or alcoholism has been brought in any Circuit Court, Probate Court or Municipal Court within Faulkner County.

**SECTION 2:** Faulkner County has a Public Defender System established by Faulkner County Quorum Court Ordinance 91-49 (December 18, 1991). There is a need for additional funding for the Public Defender, to provide adequate investigation in the carrying out of his duties.

**SECTION 5:** The provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and in the event any section hereof is determined to be invalid, it shall not impair any other sections, which are valid and can be given effect without the invalid part of said ordinance.

**SECTION 6:** It is hereby determined that the adoption of this ordinance is necessary for the safety and welfare of the citizens of Faulkner County and the furtherance of the Quorum Court's duty to provide adequate protection for its citizens, an emergency is hereby declared and this



BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO LEVY A ONE PERCENT (1%) COUNTY SALES AND USE TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF DESIGNING, BUILDING AND EQUIPPING A COUNTY SEAT LIBRARY AND COUNTY LIBRARY BRANCHES; TO ESTABLISH A SYSTEM FOR THE REBATE; TO DEFINE "SINGLE TRANSACTION"; TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

**SECTION 1:** There is hereby levied a countywide sales tax of one percent (1) upon the gross receipts from the sale at retail within the county on or after the 1st day of May 1992, of all items which are now subject or may hereafter be subject to the Arkansas Gross Receipts Tax, as provided by Arkansas Code Annotated 26-74-201 through 26-74-223. Said sales and use tax shall be collected until 30 April 1993.

**SECTION 2:** There is hereby levied a countywide use tax upon the storage, use or consumption within Faulkner County, Arkansas, of tangible personal property purchased, leased or rented from any retailer outside the state on or after the 1st day of May 1992, for storage, use or other consumption in Faulkner County, Arkansas; at the rate of one percent (1%) of the sale price of the property or, in the case of leases or rentals, of said lease or rental price, as provided by Arkansas Code Annotated 26-74-201 through 26-74-223. Said sales use tax shall be collected until 30 April 1993.

**SECTION 3:** The levy, exemption and collection of the countywide sales tax and the county-wide use tax imposed by this ordinance shall be made in accordance with, (A) all applicable definitions and other provisions of the Arkansas Gross Receipts Tax Act, as amended; and the Arkansas Compensating Tax Act (Use Tax), as amended, except that the definition of single transaction as set out herein shall apply; and (B) the existing rules and regulations pertaining to the Arkansas Gross Receipts Tax and the Arkansas Compensating Tax as promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, Division of Revenues, State of Arkansas; and (C) the provisions set forth in Arkansas Code Annotated 26-74-201 through 26-74-223.

**SECTION 4:** A person, from whom taxes levied by this ordinance have been collected may be entitled to a rebate in excess of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), paid by the taxpayer to Faulkner County on a single transaction pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated 26-74-213 through 26-74-220. Any taxpayer who pays a countywide sales or use tax to Faulkner County on or after the 1st day of May 1992, in excess of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) on any single transaction may file a claim with the Faulkner County Comptroller for a rebate of the excess tax paid. The claim shall be duly verified according to law, and accompanied by (a) a cash receipt or invoice showing the amount of sales or use tax charged and (b) proof of payment of the taxes.

Claims shall be filed within sixty (60) days of the date of purchase. If the County Judge allows the claim, the County Clerk shall refund to the claimant the excess tax paid by him. Provided, however, where a rebate would be due pursuant to the provisions of this subchapter as a result of the purchase of a new or used motor vehicle and where the tax thereon is collected directly from the purchaser pursuant to the provisions of ACA 26-52-510, then the director shall collect only the amount of tax due less the amount to which the purchaser would be entitled under the rebate provisions of this subchapter.

**SECTION 5:** The term "single transaction" for the purpose of rebate under this Ordinance, shall be defined according to the nature of the goods purchased, as follows:

(A) When two or more devices in which, upon which, or by which any person or property is, or may be, transported or drawn, including but not limited to on-road vehicles, whether required to be licensed or not, off-road vehicles, farm vehicles, airplanes, water vessels, motor vehicles, or non-motorized vehicles, and mobile homes, are sold to a person by a seller, each individual unit, whether part of a "fleet" sale or not, shall be treated as a single transaction for the purpose of this ordinance, and rebate of the countywide sales and use tax be made for the excess over twenty-five (\$25.00) paid on each individual unit; provided this provision shall not apply to motor vehicles as set forth in Act 26 of 1981.

(B) The charges for utility services, which are subject to the taxes levied under this Ordinance, which are furnished on a continuous service basis, whether such services are paid daily, weekly, monthly or annually, for the purpose of the rebate provisions of this Ordinance, shall be computed in daily increments, and each such daily charge increment shall be considered to be a single transaction for the purposes of this Ordinance.

(C) For sales of building materials and supplies to contractors, builders or other persons, a single transaction for the purpose of this Ordinance, shall be deemed to be any single sale which is reflected on a single invoice, receipt or statement, on which aggregate sales or use tax figure has been reported and remitted to the State.

(D) When two or more items of major appliances, commercial appliances, major equipment and machinery are sold, each individual unit shall be treated as a single transaction for the purpose of this Ordinance.

(E) For groceries, drug items, dry goods and other tangible personal property and/or services not otherwise expressly covered in this section, a single transaction shall be deemed to be any single sale which is reflected on a single invoice, receipt or statement, on which an aggregate sales tax figure has been reported and remitted to the State.

**SECTION 6:** That for purposes of this County sales tax as provided for in this Ordinance as applied to the construction of any single-family residential structure, the erection of which requires the issuance of a building permit from any of the cities or county, a single transaction shall be considered to be the completed structure. The sales tax imposed by said Ordinance shall be levied based upon the final cost of the materials purchased to build said structure rather than the incremental sales of materials used in said construction. Not more than one rebate per residence shall be paid and rebate requests must be submitted within sixty (60) days of completion of the structure or eighteen (18) months after issuance of the building permit, whichever comes first.


**SECTION 7:** If any part of this Ordinance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance which can be made effective without invalidity.

**SECTION 8:** It is hereby found and determined that the effectiveness of the Faulkner County Library System is essential for the operation of Faulkner County government and its citizenry and that any delay in its effectiveness would work irreparable harm upon the proper administration of these entities. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effective from the date of passage and approval.





- SECTION 5:** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- SECTION 6:** It is hereby found and determined that jurors need to be adequately compensated for the performance of their duties. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.



**ORDINANCE 92-16**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A FAULKNER COUNTY MUSEUM COMMISSION, TO PRESCRIBE THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF SAID COMMISSION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**SECTION 1:** The Faulkner County Quorum Court, under the authority of Act 247 of 1977, does hereby establish the Faulkner County Museum Commission. Said Commission is established for the purpose of exploring the establishment of a Faulkner County Museum. Once the Faulkner County Museum is established, the museum shall be under the direct management and control of the Faulkner County Museum Commission, which shall consist of seven (7) members to be appointed by the county judge, subject to the confirmation and approval of the quorum court. The county judge shall specify, at the time of appointment, the respective terms of the first members appointed to the Commission in such a manner that the term of one member shall expire on January 1 of the year next following the appointment of such member. The remaining members shall be appointed in such a manner that the term of one member shall expire on January 1 of each year thereafter. Successor members shall be appointed for seven (7) year staggered terms. Members of the Commission shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified. If any vacancy shall occur on the Commission, such vacancy shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired portion of the term, in the same manner as provided for the initial appointment.

Members of the Commission shall serve without pay. The Commission shall elect one of its members as chairperson and other such officers as they deem necessary.

**SECTION 2:** The Faulkner County Museum Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

1. to buy, lease, lend, acquire, and own real and personal property required in the housing and operation of the county museum.
2. to accept gifts, grants, or donations of real and personal property from the federal government, the State of Arkansas, and from other public or private groups or individuals, to be used for the purposes of this Ordinance.
3. to receive and expend funds appropriated by the Quorum Court for county museum purposes.

4. to acquire, preserve, and display items of historical or archaeological interest.
5. to enter into agreements with other counties, municipalities, the State or federal government, or any agency thereof, or with any private museum or groups or persons to exchange or loan items of historical or archaeological interest.
6. to enter into agreements with the Arkansas History Commission, the Department of Cultural and National Heritage, and other public and private agencies or persons, for the purpose of sharing services and facilities.
7. to enter into cooperative agreements under the Interlocal Cooperation Act with one or more adjoining counties to form a joint or regional museum. and in such agreements shall establish the governing organization and procedures for the operation of the joint or regional museum, including costs, financial agreements, and contributions for the operation of and sharing in the cost of the operation of such joint or regional museum.
8. to promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for the operation of the museum, including the establishment of reasonable admission charges to assist in defraying the cost of operating the museum.
9. to employ necessary personnel required in the maintenance and operation of the museum.
10. to do all other things necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 3:** The Faulkner County Quorum Court may appropriate county funds to defray, in whole or in part, the construction, maintenance, and operation of the Faulkner County Museum.





BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH FEES THAT SHALL BE CHARGED FOR MAINTAINING AND KEEPING PRISONERS OF ALL OTHER GOVERNMENTAL UNITS, TO DIRECT AND AUTHORIZE THE COLLECTION OF SAME BY THE COUNTY JUDGE, TO REPEAL FAULKNER COUNTY QUORUM COURT ORDINANCE 80-7 (MARCH 19, 1980), TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

- SECTION 1:** Faulkner County Quorum Court Ordinance 80-7 (March 19, 1980) is repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following.
- SECTION 2:** The Faulkner County Sheriff will levy fees for the provisions of law enforcement administrative support services to all other governmental units. The Faulkner County Sheriff shall levy his per diem confinement costs to other units of government when any Faulkner County confinement of prisoners from other units of government occurs.
- SECTION 3:** A prisoner shall mean any person arrested by any other governmental unit for a violation of any federal or state law or county or municipal ordinance and presented to Faulkner County Jail for incarceration.
- SECTION 4:** It shall be the obligation of the Faulkner County Sheriff's Department to maintain reports containing the name of each prisoner, the governmental unit committing the prisoner and the number of days or parts thereof each prisoner is incarcerated in the Faulkner County Jail.
- SECTION 5:** The Faulkner County Sheriff's Department shall charge and collect per diem costs of \$30.00 per day for adults and \$90.00 per day for juveniles, per prisoner per day or any part thereof for any and all prisoners incarcerated by any other governmental unit in the Faulkner County Jail. Per diem costs are subject to recalculation at any time and solely at the option of Faulkner County. The Faulkner County Sheriff shall have the authority to negotiate an exchange of prisoners with other governmental units to allow for an offset of per diem charges.
- SECTION 6:** All funds collected pursuant to this ordinance shall be accounted for and turned over to the County Treasurer as they are received and shall be deposited by said County Treasurer into the County General Fund.
- SECTION 7:** If any other governmental unit shall neglect, fail or refuse to pay the fee for prisoners as charged by the

office of the County Judge, the Faulkner County Sheriff shall thereafter refuse to accept any prisoner of the said governmental unit, until the fee charged has been paid and brought current. All fees shall be due and payable by the 10th day of the succeeding month in which billed.

**SECTION 8:** Medical or dental treatment shall be provided to any prisoner as required in order to safeguard their physical and mental well being. Treatment costs shall be billed directly to the governmental unit responsible for the arrest of the prisoner.





## FAULKNER COUNTY "USE OF FORCE" POLICY

### 1. PURPOSE

a. This policy is NOT intended to restrict the use of deadly force in situations where any person is endangered by the use or threatened use of deadly force by another. Similarly, this policy is not intended to restrict officers from drawing their firearms pursuant to official duties when circumstances indicate the possibility of danger to themselves or others.

b. The purpose of this policy is to protect human life, including the law enforcement officer's life. In order to be consistent with that purpose, use of deadly force must be limited to situations of strong and compelling need as necessary for the protection of human life.

c. All officers shall be issued a copy of and be instructed in the use of this Use of Force Policy before being authorized to carry a firearm.

### 2. DEFINITIONS

a. Physical force - any bodily impact, restraint, or confinement, or the threat thereof.

b. Deadly physical force - physical force that under the circumstances in which it is used is readily capable of causing death or serious physical injury.

c. Reasonable belief - the facts or circumstances the officer knows, or should know, are such as to cause an ordinary and prudent person to act or think in a similar way under similar circumstances.

d. Serious physical injury - a bodily injury that creates a substantial risk of death; causes serious permanent disfigurement; or results in long-term loss or impairment of the functioning of any bodily member or organ.

e. Violent felony - a felony that involves the use or threatened use of deadly force by the felon.

### 3. JUSTIFIED USE OF "PHYSICAL FORCE"

Use of non-deadly physical force or threatened use of deadly physical force is limited to the following situations:

a. When the officer believes it is necessary to affect an arrest or to prevent the escape from custody of an arrested person, unless the officer knows that the arrest is unlawful; or



b. When the officer reasonably believes it necessary to defend himself or a third person from the use of physical force while effecting or attempting to effect an arrest or while preventing or attempting to prevent an escape.

#### 4. JUSTIFIED USE OF DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE

a. To effect an arrest or to prevent the escape from custody of an arrested person whom the officer reasonably believes;

- 1) has committed or attempted to commit a felony;
- 2) would use deadly force if not immediately apprehended;

and

- 3) the felon cannot otherwise be apprehended.

b. To defend himself or a third person from what he reasonably believes to be the use or imminent use of deadly force.

#### 5. PROHIBITED USE OF DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE

a. Deadly physical force shall not be used against any misdemeanor, including an escaping misdemeanor.

b. Deadly physical force shall not be used when the deadly physical force will create substantial danger to third persons.

c. Deadly physical force shall not be used to apprehend perpetrators of crimes solely against property.

d. Warning shots are deadly physical force and shall not be used. When use of deadly physical force is warranted, officers shall fire for effect and not for warning.

e. Deadly physical force shall not be used to apprehend persons merely suspected of having committed a violent felony. Suspicion must be well founded upon fact and knowledge sufficient to establish probable cause.

f. Shooting from a moving vehicle is a dangerous and generally ineffective use of deadly physical force which shall be avoided in all instances except those which do not endanger innocent persons and are a use of deadly physical force immediately justified by unusual or mitigating circumstances.

g. Officers will not cock their firearms unless they are justified in using deadly physical force.

h. Shots shall not be fired at or into an occupiable structure, vehicle (including a vehicle that runs a roadblock), or other place where the violent felon is suspected to be hiding, except when there is no doubt as to the offender's location and the use of deadly physical force or imminent use of deadly physical force is being directed from that location at an officer or a third person.

#### **6. NON-DISCIPLINARY RELIEF FROM DUTY**

a. In every instance in which an officer uses deadly physical force and where such use of force results in death or serious bodily injury to another person, the officer will be immediately relieved of normal duty.

b. Assignment to a relieved-of-duty status shall be non-disciplinary, with no loss of pay or benefits.

c. Automatic relief from duty with full pay and benefits is for two purposes: 1) to address the personal and emotional needs of an officer involved in the injurious use of deadly force; and 2) to assure the community that verification of all facts surrounding such incidents are fully and professionally explored.

d. Officers so relieved from duty shall remain on a relieved-of-duty status until notified but shall remain available to the Department or other law enforcement investigators until investigation of the incident is concluded.

#### **7. REPORT OF USE OF DEADLY FORCE REQUIRED**

Each use of deadly physical force shall be immediately reported to the Communications Center who shall immediately notify the:

- a. Shift commander;
- b. Sheriff;
- c. County Prosecuting Attorney.

#### **8. REQUIRED WRITTEN USE OF FORCE REPORTS**

A written incident report shall be submitted to the Sheriff whenever an officer:

- a. Discharges a weapon, other than in training or for recreational purposes;
- b. Takes an action that results in (or is alleged to have resulted in) injury or death of another person.

## 9. DEADLY FORCE REVIEW BY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY

a. The Prosecuting Attorney shall be requested in writing to review and evaluate all incidents resulting in death or serious physical injury to an officer or other person during a law enforcement activity.

b. The Sheriff, at his discretion, may ask the Prosecuting Attorney to review any firearms discharge.

c. The objective of requesting prosecutorial review is to seek written findings and recommendations delivered to the Sheriff concerning the use of force, stating:

1. avoidability of similar incidents in the future;
2. adequacy of training;
3. adherence to training;
4. adequacy of supervision;
5. adequacy of investigation; and
6. policy compliance

**FAULKNER COUNTY**  
**EXPOSURE CONTROL PLAN**

1 SEPTEMBER 1992

1. **SCOPE AND PURPOSE:** Employees are at risk of contracting infectious diseases each time they are exposed to bloodborne pathogens. Any exposure incident may result in infection and subsequent illness. Since it is possible to become infected from a single exposure incident, **IT IS THE POLICY OF FAULKNER COUNTY TO PREVENT EXPOSURE INCIDENTS WHENEVER POSSIBLE.** Toward that end, and in accordance with OSHA's Bloodborne Pathogen Standard (29 CFR 1910.1030), we have established this **Exposure Control Plan.** The purpose of this Plan is to identify the positions whose duties include those tasks, and to implement controls which will significantly reduce the risk of infection by bloodborne pathogens. The plan also includes provisions for all affected employees to receive **Hepatitis B** vaccinations, training and if necessary, confidential medical evaluations and follow up.

2. **DEFINITIONS:**

A. **Blood** - human blood, human blood components and products made from human blood.

B. **Bloodborne Pathogens** - pathogenic microorganisms that are present in human blood and that can cause disease in humans. These include, but are not limited to, hepatitis B virus (HBV) and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).

C. **Contaminated** - the presence or the reasonably anticipated presence of blood or other potentially infectious materials on an item or surface.

D. **Contaminated laundry** - laundry which has been soiled with blood or other potentially infectious materials or may contain sharps.

E. **Contaminated sharps** - any contaminated object that can penetrate the skin including, but not limited to, needles, scalpels, broken glass, and exposed ends of dental wires.

F. **Decontamination** - the use of physical or chemical means to remove, inactivate, or destroy bloodborne pathogens on a surface or item to the point where they are no longer capable of transmitting infectious particles and the surface or item is rendered safe for handling, use or disposal.

G. **Engineering controls** - control (e.g. sharps disposal containers, self-seathing needles) that isolate or remove the bloodborne pathogens hazard from the workplace.

H. Exposure incident - specific eye, mouth, other mucous membrane, non-intact skin, or parenteral contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials that results from the performance of an employee's duties.

I. Handwashing facilities - facility providing an adequate supply of running potable water, soap and single use towels or hot air drying machines.

J. Occupational exposure - reasonably anticipated skin, eye, mucous membrane, or parenteral contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials that may result from the performance of an employee's duties.

K. Other potentially infectious materials - the following body fluids: semen, vaginal secretions, cerebrospinal fluid, synovial fluid, pleural fluid, amniotic fluid, any body fluid that is visibly contaminated with blood, and all body fluids in situations where it is difficult or impossible to differentiate between body fluids and any unfixed tissue or organ (other than intact skin) from a human (living or dead).

L. Parenteral - piercing mucous membranes or the skin barrier through such events as needlesticks, human bites, cuts, and abrasions.

M. Personal protective equipment - specialized clothing or equipment worn by an employee for protection against a hazard. General work clothes (e.g. uniforms, pants, shirts, or blouses) not intended to function as protection against a hazard are not considered to be personal protective equipment.

N. Regulated waste - liquid or semi-liquid blood or other potentially infectious materials; contaminated items that would release blood or other potentially infectious materials in a liquid or semi-liquid state if compressed; items that are caked with dried blood or other potentially infectious materials and are capable of releasing these materials during handling; and contaminated sharps.

O. Source individual - any individual, living or dead, whose blood or other potentially infectious materials may be a source of occupational exposure to employees.

P. Sterilize - the use of a physical or chemical procedure to destroy all microbial life including highly resistant bacterial endospores.

Q. Universal precautions - an approach to infection control. According to the concept of Universal Precautions, all human blood and certain human body fluids are treated as if known to be infectious for HIV, HBV, and other bloodborne pathogens.

R. Work practice controls - controls that reduce the likelihood of exposure by altering the manner in which a task is performed.

### 3. EXPOSURE DETERMINATION

A. Evaluation - The Human Resources Manager must evaluate the duties, tasks, and procedures of all employees in each job classification in each work area in making the Exposure Determination.

This evaluation and Exposure determination will identify all job classifications, tasks, procedures, and groups of related tasks and procedures which involve occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens without regard to the use of Personal Protective Equipment.

B. Schedule - This evaluation and Exposure Determination must be completed by June, 1992, and reviewed and updated at least annually by the Human Resources Manager in conjunction with the Safety Committee.

#### C. Exposure Determination Results

1. The following is a list of job classifications in which all employees in those job classifications have occupational exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials.

Fireman EMT  
Trash collection  
Janitorial

2. The following is a list of job classifications in which some employees have occupational exposure to blood or other potentially infectious materials. These employees must be offered the Hepatitis B vaccination within 8 hours of exposure. They do not require the Hepatitis B series until they have the exposure, but then it must be in 8 hours.

Police Officer  
Jailer  
Lifeguard  
Fireman (not EMT)  
Landfill Operator  
OES

### 4. METHODS OF COMPLIANCE

A. All employees in the above listed job classifications must observe **Universal Precautions** when performing any tasks or procedures which may result in occupational exposure to blood or potentially infectious materials.

B. Engineering or work practice controls shall be used to eliminate or minimize employee exposure. Where occupational exposure remains after institution of these controls, personal protective equipment shall also be used.

I. Engineering controls shall be examined and maintained or replaced on a regular schedule, to ensure their effectiveness.

II. Handwashing facilities shall be provided which are readily accessible to employees.

III. Employees shall wash their hands immediately or as soon as feasible after removal of gloves or other personal protective equipment.

IV. Employees shall wash their hands and other skin with soap and water, or flush mucous membranes with water immediately or as soon as feasible following contact of such body areas with blood or other potentially infectious materials.

V. Eating, drinking, smoking, and applying cosmetics or lip balm and handling contact lenses are prohibited in work areas where there is a reasonable likelihood of occupational exposure.

VI. Food and drink shall not be kept in shelves, cabinets or on countertops or benchtops where blood or other potentially infectious materials are present.

VII. All procedures involving blood or other potentially infectious materials shall be performed in such a manner as to minimize splashing, spraying, spattering and generation of droplets of these substances.

VIII. Equipment which may become contaminated with blood or other potentially infectious materials shall be examined prior to servicing or shipping and shall be decontaminated as necessary, unless the employer can demonstrate that decontamination of such equipment or portions of such equipment is not feasible. A readily observable label shall be attached to the equipment stating that portions remain contaminated. Employees shall be informed prior to handling, servicing or shipping, so that appropriate precautions can be taken.

## 5. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

A. Provision - Appropriate personal protective equipment will be provided, at no cost to the employee. Appropriate protective equipment may include, but not be limited to, gloves, gowns, face shields or masks and eye protection, and mouthpieces, resuscitation bags, pocket masks or other ventilation devices. Personal protective equipment will be considered "appropriate" only if it does not permit

blood or other potentially infectious materials to pass through to or reach the employee's work clothes, street clothes, undergarments, skin, eyes, mouth or other mucous membranes under normal conditions of use and for the duration of time which the protective equipment will be used.

B. Use - Employees will use appropriate personal protective equipment, unless it is the employee's professional judgment that in the specific instance its use would have prevented the delivery of health care or public safety services or would have posed an increased health hazard to the safety of the worker or co-workers. When the employee makes this judgment, the circumstances shall be investigated and documented in order to determine whether changes can be instituted to prevent such occurrences in the future.

C. Accessibility - Appropriate personal protective equipment in appropriate sizes will be readily accessible at each worksite or issued to employees. Hypoallergenic gloves, glove liners, powderless gloves, or other similar alternatives shall be readily accessible to those employees who are allergic to the gloves normally provided

D. Cleaning, laundering and disposal - Personal protective equipment shall be cleaned, laundered or disposed of at no cost to the employee.

E. Repair and replacement - Personal protective equipment shall be repaired and replaced at no cost to the employee. If a garment is penetrated by blood or other potentially infectious materials, the garment shall be immediately removed or as soon as feasible, but prior to leaving the work area. When personal protective equipment is removed, it shall be placed in an appropriately designated area or container for storage, washing, decontamination or disposal.

F. Gloves - Gloves shall be worn when it can be reasonably anticipated that an employee may have hand contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials and when handling or touching contaminated items or surfaces. Disposable or single use gloves shall be replaced as soon as practical when contaminated or as soon as feasible if they are torn, punctured or when their ability to function as a barrier is compromised. Disposable gloves shall not be washed or decontaminated for re-use. Utility gloves may be decontaminated for re-use if the integrity of the glove is not compromised. They will be discarded if cracked, peeling, torn, punctured, or exhibit other signs of deterioration or when their ability to function as a barrier is compromised.

G. Gowns, aprons, and other protective body clothing - Appropriate protective clothing such as, but not limited to, gowns, aprons, or similar outer garments shall be worn in occupational exposure situations. The type and characteristics will depend upon the task and degree of exposure anticipated.

## 6. HOUSEKEEPING

A. General - Worksites shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. All equipment and environmental and working surfaces shall be cleaned and decontaminated after contact with blood or other infectious materials.

B. Work surfaces - Contaminated work surfaces shall be decontaminated with an appropriate disinfectant after completion of procedures, immediately after contaminated and at the end of each work shift if the surface may have become contaminated since the last cleaning.

C. Protective coverings - Plastic wrap, aluminum foil or imperviously-backed absorbent paper used to cover equipment and environmental surfaces, shall be removed and replaced as soon as feasible when they become overtly contaminated or at the end of the work shift, if they may have become contaminated during the shift. All bins, pails, cans and similar receptacles intended for reuse which have a reasonable likelihood for becoming contaminated with blood or other potentially infectious materials shall be inspected and decontaminated on a regularly scheduled basis and cleaned and decontaminated immediately or as soon as feasible upon visible contamination. Broken glassware which may be contaminated shall not be picked up directly with the hands. It shall be cleaned by mechanical means such as a brush and dust pan or tongs. Reusable sharps that are contaminated with blood or other potentially infectious materials shall not be stored or processed in a manner that requires employees to reach by hand into the containers where these sharps have been placed.

## 7. REGULATED WASTE

A. Contaminated sharps, discarding and containment - Contaminated sharps shall be discarded immediately or as soon as feasible in containers that are capable of being closed, puncture resistant, leakproof on sides and bottom and labeled or color coded.

B. Laundry - Contaminated laundry shall be handled as little as possible with a minimum of agitation. It shall be bagged or containerized at the location where it is used and shall not be sorted or rinsed in the location of use. It shall be placed and transported in bags or containers labeled or color coded. Whenever contaminated laundry is wet and presents a reasonable likelihood of soak-through or leakage from the bag or container, the laundry shall be placed and transported in bags or containers which prevent soak-through and/or leakage of fluids to the exterior. Employees shall wear protective gloves and other appropriate personal protective equipment when coming in contact with contaminated laundry.

## 8. HEPATITIS B VACCINE AND POST-EXPOSURE EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

A. Hepatitis B vaccine shall be available to employees who have occupational exposure. Post-exposure evaluation and follow-



up will be available to all employees who have had an exposure incident. This will be offered at no cost to the employee and a reasonable time and place, by a licensed physician or healthcare professional.

B. Hepatitis B Vaccination - Hepatitis B vaccine shall be made available to all employees after they have received training and within ten (10) days of initial assignment to an area of occupational exposure, unless the employee has previously received the complete hepatitis B vaccination series, antibody testing has revealed that the employee is immune or the vaccine is contraindicated for medical reasons. Participation in a prescreening program is not a prerequisite for receiving hepatitis B vaccination. The employee may initially decline the vaccination and at a later date, while still covered under the standard, accept the vaccination. If the vaccination is declined, the employee must sign a statement so stating their declination. Following a report of an exposure incident, the exposed employee will be afforded a confidential medical evaluation and follow-up. The evaluation will include the circumstances under which the exposure incident occurred and identification of the source unless prohibited by law. The source individual shall be tested, unless prohibited by law, and the results made available to the employee. Counseling and evaluation of reported illnesses shall also be provide to the employee.

## 9. HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

A. The Healthcare professional shall be provided with a description of the employees duties, the routes of exposure and the circumstances under which the exposure occurred, results of the source individual's blood test and all medical records relevant to the treatment.

B. The employee shall be provided a copy of the healthcare professional's opinion within fifteen (15) days of completion of the evaluation.

## 11. COMMUNICATION OF HAZARDS TO EMPLOYEES

Labels and signs shall be fluorescent orange or orange-red with lettering or symbols of blue or black. Red bags or containers may be substituted for labels

## 12. TRAINING

A. Training will be provide at no cost to the employees and during working hours. Training will be conducted upon initial assignment to tasks where occupational exposure may occur, within 90 days of publication of this standard and at least annually thereafter.

B. Records shall be maintained to reflect dates of training, contents or summary of training session, the names and qualifications of the trainers and the names of attendees. These records shall be maintained for three (3) years from the date of training.

### 13. MEDICAL RECORDS

A. Medical records shall be maintained on all employees that may have occupational exposure. The record will reflect the name and social security number of the employee, vaccination status, a copy of the results of examinations and follow-up procedures and healthcare professional's opinions.

**WAIVER OF HEPATITIS B VACCINATION**

I understand that due to my occupational exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials I may be at risk of acquiring the Hepatitis B virus (HBV) infection. I have been given the opportunity to be vaccinated with the Hepatitis B vaccine at no charge to myself. However, I decline Hepatitis B vaccination at this time. I understand that by declining this vaccine, I continue to be at risk of acquiring Hepatitis B, a serious disease. If in the future I continue to have occupational exposure to blood or other potentially infectious materials and I want to be vaccinated with the Hepatitis B vaccine, I can receive the vaccination at no charge to me.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1993.

**SECTION 1. ANNUAL BUDGET ADOPTED BY REFERENCE.** The annual budget for calendar year 1993 identified as "1993 Annual Budget, Faulkner County, Arkansas", dated 15 December 1992 is hereby adopted by reference. A copy of said budget shall be filed in the Office of the County Clerk and shall be available for inspection and copying by any person during normal office hours.

**SECTION 2. NONRESTRICTED EXPENDITURE CATEGORIES.** Expenditure of funds appropriated by this Ordinance shall not be restricted to the line item expenditure codes comprising the four major categories of expenditures Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, and Capital Outlays, but shall be restricted to office/departmental expenditures within the above enumerated four major categories of expenditures except for funds appropriated for personnel salaries and wages and related employee benefits. Personnel expenditures shall not exceed the dollar amounts, number of employees, and salary or wage rates specified in the annual budget or an amendment thereto.

**SECTION 3. EXPENDITURE RESTRICTED TO SPECIFIED FUNDS.** No expenditure of appropriated funds shall be made from any fund other than the fund specified in the Ordinance, or an amendment thereto.

**SECTION 4. TRANSFERS.** Any transfer of monies between the various funds of the County or between the four major categories of expenditures - Personal Services, Supplies, other Services and Charges, and Capital Outlays - shall be made only with prior approval of the Faulkner County Quorum Court. Provided, however, all transfers budgeted for in the annual budget shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

If approved, the funds shall be divided equally between the County General Fund and County Road Fund. Funds for the County Road Department will be used specifically for paving and gravel.

SECTION 2: The ballot title to be submitted to the electors of Faulkner County for vote shall be set out as follows:

"FOR ADOPTION OF A ONE-HALF (1/2%) SALES AND USE TAX TO BE LEVIED WITHIN FAULKNER COUNTY WITH ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS OF 1/2 TO THE COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT, SPECIFICALLY PAVING AND GRAVEL, AND 1/2 TO THE COUNTY GENERAL FUND."

"AGAINST ADOPTION OF A ONE-HALF (1/2%) SALES AND USE TAX TO BE LEVIED WITHIN FAULKNER COUNTY WITH ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS OF 1/2 TO THE COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT, SPECIFICALLY PAVING AND GRAVEL, AND 1/2 TO THE COUNTY GENERAL FUND."

SECTION 3: Upon approval of the electors, the one-half percent (1/2%) sales and use tax is hereby levied. Collection of this tax will cease 12-31-96.

All payments out of the Public Defender Fund will be for the payment of reasonable and necessary costs incurred in the legal representation of indigent persons in Faulkner County as required by Act 1193 of 1993, on the condition that the presiding Judge of the court has made a finding that the defendant is, in fact, indigent under standards to be established by the Arkansas Public Defender Commission.

WHEREAS, Arkansas Code Annotated §16-10-209 (3)(F)(2) authorized county legislation which provides for an alternative method of time payment allocation whereby all time payments shall be allocated fifty percent (50%) to court costs and fifty percent (50%) to fines;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Quorum Court of the County of Faulkner, State of Arkansas:


Section 1: That there is hereby authorized an alternative method of time payment allocation of fines and court costs by the Municipal Court whereby all time payments shall be allocated fifty percent (50%) to court costs and fifty percent (50%) to fines. 
Section 2: That all other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict.

(E) The court clerk shall furnish the presiding judge and the police department, marshal's office, or sheriff's office monthly with a list of all unpaid time payment accounts for which a payment has not been received within the past thirty (30) days. The presiding judge shall then take the necessary action deemed appropriate in the circumstances;

(F)(1) All time payments shall initially be deemed to be collections of court costs until the costs have been collected in full, with any remaining time payments representing collections of fines. The court clerk shall prepare at least monthly a separate court report for all time payments made on accounts. The monetary settlement for this separate court report shall be made on or before the fifth day of the next-following month. No settlement shall be made on any time payment account until all of the court costs applicable to the account have been collected in full, except that court costs on DWI cases may be settled as collected. Any subsequent collections on the time payment account, representing fines collected, shall be settled on the appropriate court report as they are collected.

(2) A municipal or county governing body may provide by appropriate municipal or county legislation an alternative method of time payment allocation as follows:

(a) All time payments shall be allocated fifty percent (50%) to court costs and fifty percent (50%) to fines. Whenever either court costs or fines are fully paid, all remaining time payments shall be allocated to remaining amounts due.

(b) The court clerk shall prepare at least monthly a separate court report for all time payments made on accounts. The monetary settlement for this separate court report shall be made on or before the fifth day the next-following month.

(6) RECONCILIATION OF COMPLETED TICKET BOOKS TO ARREST REPORT:

(A) The court clerk shall, on a quarterly basis, on or before the fifteenth day of the month following the end of the calendar quarter, reconcile the individual tickets in the completed ticket book to the individual tickets as reflected on the arrest reports;

(B) For any discrepancies noted in the above reconciliation, the court clerk shall prepare a written list and present this list to the court's judge for his appropriate action.

ORDINANCE 93-26

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1994.

SECTION 1: ANNUAL BUDGET ADOPTED BY REFERENCE. The annual budget for calendar year 1994 identified as "1994 Annual Budget, Faulkner County, Arkansas", dated 14 December, 1993, is hereby adopted by reference. A copy of said budget shall be filed in the Office of the County Clerk and shall be available for inspection and copying by any person during normal business hours.

SECTION 2: NONRESTRICTED EXPENDITURE CATEGORIES. Expenditures of funds appropriated by this Ordinance shall not be restricted to the line item expenditure codes comprising the four major categories of expenditures - Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, and Capital Outlays, but shall be restricted to office/departmental expenditures within the above enumerated four major categories of expenditures except for funds appropriated for personnel salaries and wages and related employee benefits. Personnel expenditures shall not exceed the dollar amounts, number of employees, and salary or wage rates specified in the annual budget or an amendment thereto.

SECTION 3: EXPENDITURE RESTRICTED TO SPECIFIED FUNDS. No expenditure of appropriated funds shall be made from any fund other than the fund specified in the Ordinance, or an amendment thereto.

SECTION 4: TRANSFERS. Any transfer of monies between the various funds of the County or between the four major categories of expenditures - Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, and Capital Outlays - shall be made only with prior approval of the Faulkner County Quorum Court. Provided, however, all transfers budgeted for in the annual budget shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.
