ORDINANCE 13-01

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORGANIZATIONAL ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING MEETING TIMES FOR THE NEW QUORUM COURT.

WHEREAS, the term for the new Quorum Court began on January 1, 2013, and the initial meeting for the new Quorum Court, to be held within Five (5) days of the beginning of the term, was set by the County Judge as per Arkansas Code Annotated § 14-14-904, and,

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court desires to establish its regular meeting schedule by ordinance pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 14-14-904, and the Court finds that it is in the best interests of the Court to do so.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF FAULKNER COUNTY, ARKANSAS, THAT:

Article 1: Unless modified by subsequent ordinance, the regular monthly meeting of the Quorum Court shall hereafter be held on the Third (3rd) Tuesday of each month at 7:00pm.

Article 2: The regular monthly meetings of the Quorum Court shall be held at the Faulkner County Courthouse, Courtroom C. If Courtroom C is unavailable, the Justices of the Peace will be timely notified of the meeting location by the Secretariat.

Article 3: The regular monthly meeting of the Budget and Finance Committee shall be held on the Second (2nd) Tuesday of every month at 6:00pm.

Article 4: The regular monthly meetings of the Budget and Finance Committee shall be held at the Faulkner County Courthouse, Courtroom C. If Courtroom C is unavailable, the committee members will be timely notified of the meeting location by the Secretariat.

Article 5: It is hereby recognized that immediate establishment of dates, times, and locations of the regular meetings of the Quorum Court and the Budget and Finance Committee thereof is necessary and is required by state law. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance being necessary for preservation and protection of the public health, safety, and welfare of Faulkner County, this Ordinance shall be in force and take effect upon passage and publication.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED: AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT FAULKNER COUNTY ORDINANCE 88-15 REGARDING ELIGIBILITY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE COUNTY'S HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 88-15 was duly passed by the Faulkner County Quorum Court on September 19, 1988, amending Ordinance 87-20; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance 88-15 amended Ordinance 87-20 in order to "allow a retired employee, receiving retirement benefits from the [C]ounty's Retirement System, who has at least 10 years of active [C]ounty employment to participate in the [C]ounty's Health Insurance coverage, by payment of their individual insurance premium to the County Clerk in a timely fashion;" and,

WHEREAS, this continues to be a beneficial option to eligible retired County employees; and,

WHEREAS, it is desirable and beneficial to expand eligibility to include other individuals associated with County service as detailed below, at no cost to the County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF FAULKNER COUNTY, ARKANSAS:

Ordinances 87-20 and 88-15 are amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE 1: It is in the best interest of Faulkner County, County elected officials, retired employees, and part-time employees that they participate in the County's Health Insurance program.

ARTICLE 2: In addition to other eligible persons the following persons are eligible to participate in the County health insurance program, at the person's own expense, provided that the person meets all other eligibility requirements for the health insurance program:

- A. Former Faulkner County elected officials.
- B. Former and current Justices of the Peace.
- C. Part-time Faulkner County employees, while employed by the County.
- D. Authorized volunteers including Faulkner County Emergency Squad and Faulkner County Sheriff's Office Reserves.

- E. Former Faulkner County employees who:
 - a. Have at least 5 years' active County employment, or
 - b. Are retired and receiving County retirement benefits, or
 - c. Who have suffered a disability as determined by the Workman's Compensation Commission.

ARTICLE 3: Regarding the aforementioned persons, in order to participate and remain eligible the following requirements must be met, in addition to all other County health insurance program eligibility requirements:

- A. The person must complete and maintain the required documentation with the County Clerk's office; and,
- B. Payment of the premium must be made at the person's expense and must be made in a timely manner.

ARTICLE 4: This Ordinance shall not operate to terminate eligibility for any person who is currently participating in the County's health insurance program.


ARTICLE 5: The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be separable and if any section, phrase, or provision shall for any reason be declared to be invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the sections, phrases, and provisions.

ARTICLE 6: This ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and signature by the County Judge.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL REVENUE PROMISSORY NOTES (JUSTICE BUILDING PROJECT); PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE NOTES; AND PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

WHEREAS, the Quorum Court of Faulkner County, Arkansas (the "County") has determined that the County is in need of the construction and equipping of a new Justice Building to be utilized for the conduct of the business of various Courts in the County on lands currently owned by the County (the "Justice Building");

WHEREAS, the County can obtain a portion of the necessary funds to construct and equip the Justice Building by issuing a General Revenue Promissory Note (Justice Building Project), Series 2013, in the principal amount of \$4,000,000 and a General Revenue Promissory Note (Justice Building Project), Series 2014, in the principal amount of \$1,000,000, the total aggregate principal amounts of each Note not to exceed \$5,000,000.00 (individually, the "Note", collectively, the "Notes").

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Quorum Court of Faulkner County, Arkansas:

Article 1. The Quorum Court hereby finds that the Justice Building will have a useful life of more than one (1) year.

Article 2. Under the authority of the Constitution and laws of the State of Arkansas (the "State"), including particularly Amendment No. 78 to the Arkansas Constitution, as amended by Amendment 89 to the Arkansas Constitution (as amended, "Amendment 78"): (i) Faulkner County, Arkansas, General Revenue Promissory Note (Justice Building Project), Series 2013 is hereby authorized and ordered issued in the principal amount of \$4,000,000.00; and (ii) Faulkner County, Arkansas, General Revenue Promissory Note (Justice Building Project), Series 2014 is hereby authorized and ordered issued in the principal amount of \$1,000,000.00, each for the purpose of financing a portion of the costs of constructing and equipping the Justice Building. The aggregate principal amounts of the Notes shall not exceed \$5,000,000. The Series 2014 Note shall be executed and delivered no later than March 31, 2014. Each Note shall bear interest at an interest rate not to exceed 2.24%, and shall mature on that date which is five (5) years from the date of each respective Note. Each Note shall be dated as of the date of its execution and shall be issuable only as a fully registered Note without coupons.

Article 3. The Notes shall be executed on behalf of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the County Judge and County Clerk and shall have impressed or imprinted thereon the seal of the County.

Article 4. The Notes shall be in substantially the following form and the County Judge and County Clerk are hereby expressly authorized and directed to make all recitals contained therein:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

THAT, Faulkner County, Arkansas (the "County"), acting by and through its County Judge and County Clerk, duly authorized by Ordinance duly adopted by the Quorum Court of the County, for value received, hereby promises to pay to the order of FIRST SECURITY BANK, at its offices in Conway, Arkansas, or unto its successors and assigns (the "Lender") the principal sum of FOUR (or ONE) MILLION AND NO 100/thS DOLLARS (\$4,000,000.00 or \$1,000,000.00), or so much thereof as is advanced, with interest, per annum, at the rate stated above from date until due as herein provided, all to be paid and payable in such coin or currency of the United States of America as at the time of payment shall be legal tender for the payment of public and private debts, as follows:

Commencing November 7, 2013 (or (January 10, 2014), and on the same day of each successive year thereafter, through and including November 7, 2017 (or January 10, 2018), the County shall pay to Lender all accrued and unpaid interest on the amount of principal then advanced, and on the Maturity Date, the County shall pay to Lender all accrued and unpaid interest and the total principal then advanced in a single sum.

This Note is a multiple advance Note, and may be drawn against on written order duly executed by the County Judge and County Clerk, with seal affixed, accompanied by contractor pay requests which have been approved by the architect for the Justice Building, directed to Lender. Interest shall accrue upon the Note at the stated rate from the date of each advance hereunder.

This Note is issued pursuant to and in full compliance with the Constitution and the laws of the State of Arkansas, including, without limitation, the provisions of Amendment No. 78 to the Arkansas Constitution, as amended, and pursuant to Ordinance No. 2013-16 of the County (the

“Authorizing Ordinance”). This Note shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Arkansas.

All principal and interest payments upon the Note shall be charged against and paid from the general revenues of the County for each fiscal year. Reference is hereby made to the Authorizing Ordinance for additional terms, conditions and representations upon which the Note is issued, all of which are incorporated herein by this reference.

This Note is a fully registered note, and is transferable by the Lender which is the registered owner, only upon surrender and cancellation of this Note, at which time, a new, fully registered Note of the same maturity, at the same rate, and for the same aggregate principal amount (subject, however, to credit for any payments made), will be issued to the transferee in exchange therefor. The Note is unsecured.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, Faulkner County, Arkansas has caused this Note to be executed by its County Judge and County Clerk, with its seal impressed hereon, as of the date first above mentioned.

Article 5. As provided in Amendment No. 78, the debt service payments on the Notes in each fiscal year shall be charged against and paid from the general revenues of the County for such fiscal year. For the purpose of making the debt service payments, there is hereby, and shall be appropriated to pay the Notes, an amount of general revenues of the County sufficient for such purposes. The County covenants that for each fiscal year in which the Notes are outstanding, the general revenues of the County shall exceed the amount of debt service payments due on the Notes in that fiscal year.

Article 6. The County agrees to have its financial statements audited annually by the Joint Legislative Auditing Committee, Division of Legislative Audit of the State of Arkansas, and to provide a copy thereof to the Lender on request.

Article 7. The County agrees to prepare and adopt a budget for each fiscal year in accordance with Arkansas law and, on Lender's request, to furnish the Lender with a copy of the same by January 31 of each year while the Note is outstanding. Each budget shall make provision for the payment of debt service due on the Note in that fiscal year.

Article 8. The Notes may be redeemed or pre-paid in whole or in part prior to maturity.

Article 9. If there be any default in the payment of the principal of or interest on the Notes, within ten (10) days of the due date therefor, or in the performance of any of the other covenants contained in this Ordinance, Lender may, by proper suit, compel the performance of the duties of the officials of the County under the laws of Arkansas.

No remedy conferred upon or reserved to Lender is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy or remedies, and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given under this Ordinance or by law.

Lender may waive any default which shall have been remedied before the entry of final judgment or decree in any suit, action or proceeding instituted under the provisions of this Ordinance or before the completion of the enforcement of any other remedy, but no such waiver shall extend to or affect any other existing or any subsequent default or defaults or impair any rights or remedies of Lender with respect thereto.

No delay or omission of Lender to exercise any right or power accrued upon any default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver of any such default or an acquiescence therein; and every power and remedy given by this Ordinance to Lender may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient.

In any proceeding to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance Lender, shall be entitled to recover from the County all costs of such proceeding, including reasonable attorneys fees.

Article 10. The terms of this Ordinance shall constitute a contract between the County and the Lender and no variation or change in the undertaking herein set forth shall be made while the Notes are outstanding, except as may be agreed in writing as between the County and Lender.

Article 11. (a) The County covenants that it shall not take any action or suffer or permit any action to be taken or conditions to exist which causes or may cause the interest payable on the Note to be included in gross income for federal income tax purposes. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the County covenants that the proceeds of the Note will not be used directly or indirectly in such manner as to cause the Note to be treated as "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").

(b) The County represents that it has not used or permitted the use of, and covenants that it will not use or permit the use of the Justice Building or the proceeds of the Notes, in such manner as to cause the Note to be "private activity bonds" within the meaning of Section 141 of the Code.

(c) Each Note is hereby designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Code. The County represents that the aggregate principal amount of its qualified tax-exempt obligations (excluding "private activity bonds" within the meaning of Section 141 of the Code which are not "qualified 501(c)(3) bonds" within the meaning of Section 145 of the Code), including those of its subordinate entities issued in calendar year 2013 are not expected to exceed \$10,000,000.

The County further represents pursuant to Section 148(f)(4)(D) of the Code that (i) the aggregate principal amount of its tax-exempt obligations (not including "private activity bonds" within the meaning of Section 141 of the Code), including those of its subordinate entities, to be issued in calendar year 2013 is not reasonably expected to exceed \$5,000,000, and (ii) at least 95% of the proceeds of the Note will be expended for the governmental activities of the County.

(d) The County covenants that it will take no action which would cause the Notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code. Nothing in this Article shall prohibit investments in bonds issued by the United States Treasury.

(e) The County covenants that it will submit to the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States, not later than the 15th day of the second calendar month after the close of the calendar quarter in which the Notes are issued, a statement as required by Section 149(e) of the Code.

(f) The County covenants that it will not reimburse itself from proceeds of the Notes for costs paid prior to the date the Note is issued except in compliance with United States Treasury Regulation No. 1.150-2 (the "Regulation"). This Ordinance shall constitute an "official intent" for purposes of the Regulation.

Article 12. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be separable and if any provision shall for any reason be held illegal or invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance.



Section 1: DEFINITIONS:

The following words and phrases shall have the following meaning for the purposes of this ordinance:

Animal: Every vertebrate non-human species of animal, wild or domestic, male or female, including, but not limited to, dogs, cats, livestock and other mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish.

Animal acceptance: The act of the Animal Welfare Unit accepting a dog, puppy, cat or kitten brought in to the shelter by an individual for permanent relinquishment.

Animal Rescue/Shelter: An establishment wherein a person, business, government or organization engages in the practice of providing temporary homes for stray, surrendered, or abandoned pet animals. Animals are kept at the shelter until it is reclaimed by the owner, adopted to a new owner, placed with another organization or euthanized

Animal Welfare Officer: "Animal Welfare Officer" means any person appointed by the Sheriff of Faulkner County to perform duties as assigned by the Sheriff to effectuate this Ordinance. The Sheriff or his deputy for the purpose of enforcing this Ordinance, are clothed with full police power to apprehend and impound any vicious dog or a dog thought to be infected with rabies within Faulkner County and may enter upon private property to apprehend such dog. If after request therefor, the owner of such dog shall refuse to deliver the dog to the officer, the owner shall be in violation of this Ordinance. The owner of such dog shall be responsible for all the reasonable expenses incurred in apprehending and impounding such dog.

Animal Welfare Unit: "Animal Welfare Unit" means any premises approved by the Sheriff for the purpose of enforcing this Ordinance and used as a shelter for seized, homeless, abandoned or unwanted dogs, cats or other animals. It matters not whether the shelter is owned by Faulkner County and operated under the supervision of the Sheriff or whether it is owned and operated by a municipality, humane society or animal welfare group, which has a working agreement with the Sheriff for the support of Faulkner County.

At-Large: "At Large" means any dog that is not under direct control of the owner. Any dog shall be deemed to be At Large, within the meaning of this ordinance, if it is off the premises of its owner's real property and not under adequate supervision and control of a competent person, regardless of whether the owner had actual notice or knowledge that the dog had left the owner's premises or real property. Nothing in this definition or this ordinance shall restrict the rights of a dog owner in using his dogs for valid purposes within the regulations of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission.

Cat: Any domestic or feral cat (*Felis catus* or *Felis domesticus*) over the age of six (6) months.

Dangerous dog: Any dog that according to the records of Animal Welfare Unit:

- A. has inflicted physical injury on a human being without provocation on public or private property; or
- B. has either caused physical injury or killed a domestic animal without provocation while off the owner's property; or
- C. has been previously found to be potentially dangerous, the owner having received notice of such and the dog again aggressively bites, attacks, or endangers the safety of humans or domestic animals.

Dog: Any domestic canine or canine crossbreed (*Canis familiaris*) over the age of six (6) months.

Domestic animal: Animals which are trained and kept as pets, or which commonly rely upon humans for food and shelter, including, but not limited to, dogs, puppies, cats, kittens; birds kept indoors; hamsters, gerbils and such other small rodents; chinchillas, rabbits; non-poisonous lizards, except crocodiles and alligators, and non-poisonous snakes, which animals or reptiles are capable of being maintained continuously in cages; and other living creatures generally referred

to as domestic pets. The term "domestic animals" shall also mean animals of husbandry or livestock.

Euthanasia: The act of humanely and painlessly putting an animal to death.

Kennel: An establishment wherein any person, business, or organization engages in the practice of boarding, breeding, buying, grooming, letting for hire, training for a fee, or selling dogs or other animals

Kitten: Any domestic or feral cat (*Felis catus* or *Felis domesticus*) under the age of six (6) months.

Neutered: A castrated male animal, un-sterilized dogs or cats too elderly or infirm to breed.

Owner/harbinger: Any person, group of persons, or corporations owning, keeping or harboring an animal or animals.

Potentially dangerous dog: Any dog that when unprovoked:

- A. bites a human or a domestic animal either on public or private property; or
- B. chases or approaches a person upon the streets, sidewalks, or any public grounds in a menacing fashion or apparent attitude tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury or otherwise to threaten the safety of humans or domestic animals.

Puppy: Any dog under the age of six (6) months

Repeatedly At-Large: Any dog shall be deemed to be "Repeatedly At-Large", within the meaning of this ordinance, if it is off the premises of its owner's real property and not under adequate supervision and control of a competent person, regardless of whether the owner had actual notice or knowledge that the dog had left the owner's premises or real property more than once in a 12 month period.

Restraint: An animal is under restraint within the meaning of this ordinance if it is controlled by a leash or within a vehicle being driven or parked on a street, or confined on the property of its owner or keeper.

Spayed: A female animal that has undergone an ovary-hysterectomy, un-sterilized dogs or cats too elderly or infirm to breed.

Stray: Any dog that is At-Large and that is not properly tagged;

- A. At-Large: "At Large" means any dog that is not under direct control of the owner. Any dog shall be deemed to be At Large, within the meaning of this ordinance, if it is off the premises of its owner's real property and not under adequate supervision and control of a competent person, regardless of whether the owner had actual notice or knowledge

that the dog had left the owner's premises or real property.

B. Tag/Identification: A piece of durable metal, inscribed with the name, street address and telephone number of the owner and attached to the collar or harness of the dog.

C. Tag/Rabies: A metal tag evidencing an annual vaccination by an accredited veterinarian shall be attached to the harness or collar of every dog in the county.

Vicious dog: Any dog which:

- A. causes death or serious injury to any person; or
- B. on two (2) or more occasions within a 12-month period attacks or bites a person without provocation; or
- C. on two (2) or more occasions within a 12-month period, while off the property of its owner and without provocation, kills or seriously injures another domestic animal or livestock; or
- D. is trained for dog fighting or is owned or kept for the purpose of dog fighting.

Wildlife rehabilitator: Is a person, business, or organization who provides aid to injured, orphaned, displaced, or distressed wild animals in such a way that they may survive when released to their native habitats. Activities may include direct care of wildlife and arranging suitable release sites. Rehabilitators must possess current licensing from the Arkansas game and Fish Department and must comply with all state, county, and municipal laws and ordinances.

Section 2: ENFORCEMENT:

The provisions of this ordinance shall be enforced by the Animal Welfare Officer as designated by the Sheriff of Faulkner County, Arkansas.

Section 3: IMPOUNDMENT:

Any domestic animal found to be at large within the unincorporated areas of Faulkner County, Arkansas, may be picked up by an Animal Welfare Officer and there confined in a humane manner.

Section 4: NUISANCE ANIMALS AND HAZARDOUS ANIMALS:

A. Owners of nuisance animals shall be subject to fine. Nuisance animals are any animals which infringe upon the rights of another animal or a person by any of the following:

- 1. Molest passersby or passing vehicles;

2. Attack other domestic animals;
3. Trespass on school grounds;
4. Are at large;
5. Damage private or public property;
6. Bark, whine or howl in an excessive, continuous, or untimely fashion; or
7. Interfere with refuse collection or other service personnel.

B. In the case of animals causing a noise problem and after owner of such animal has been duly notified twice that the problem needs correcting, and such correction has not been put in place, nuisance animals may then be impounded and a notice left at the owner's residence so as to provide the owner with instructions for reclaiming the animal.

C. For purposes of this section, each violation may be prosecuted as a separate or a continuous offense, pursuant to A.C.A. §14-14-906, depending on the circumstances.

D. Violation of this section shall constitute a Level One Violation, and will be sanctioned pursuant to Section 16.

Section 5: FRAUDULENT REDEMPTION OF DOMESTIC ANIMALS:

If any person shall obtain possession and custody of any domestic animal for or on behalf of the owner thereof for the purpose of avoiding payment of the fees and penalties imposed upon the owner by this ordinance, both the owner of such animal and the person so obtaining possession and custody of the animal for the owner shall be deemed to have violated the terms of this ordinance both such persons and such owner shall be punished as hereinafter provided.

Section 6: RABIES VACCINATION REQUIRED

A. All dogs, cats and other pets in the Faulkner County, Arkansas, that are subject to rabies shall be annually vaccinated against rabies by an accredited veterinarian. A metal tag evidencing such vaccination shall be attached to the harness or collar of every animal in the county. Violation of this section shall constitute a Level One Violation, and will be sanctioned pursuant to Section 16.

B. In case a tag for the rabies vaccination required by this ordinance is lost or destroyed, a duplicate shall be issued by veterinarian upon presentation of a receipt or other verification showing payment of said fee or receipt of such duplicate tag and payment of cost of duplication.

C. No tag shall be transferable from one animal to another.

D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to any dog or cat under the age of three months.

Section 7: RUNNING AT-LARGE:

- A. No person owning, possessing or keeping an animal shall allow the same to be at-large within the unincorporated areas of Faulkner County, Arkansas.
- B. Each owner shall have on his, her or its dog a collar or harness to which is securely fastened a metal plate or tag on which is legibly and permanently inscribed the name, address and/or phone number of its owner.
- C. A metal tag evidencing an annual vaccination by an accredited veterinarian shall be attached to the harness or collar of every dog in the county.
- D. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to abandon any dog in Faulkner County, Arkansas.

Section 8: INTERFERENCE:

No person shall interfere with, hinder or molest the Animal Welfare Officer in the performance of any duty of such officer or seek to release any animal in the custody of the Animal Welfare Officer except as herein provided. Violation of this section may be prosecuted as a misdemeanor or felony in accordance with A.C.A. §5-54-102 or 5-54-104.

Section 9: CITATIONS:

The Animal Welfare Officer(s) and members of the Faulkner County Sheriff's Department are hereby authorized to issue a citation for arrest as defined by the Arkansas Rules of Criminal Procedure to the owner, keeper or possessor of any dog or cat violating any provision of this ordinance. The citation shall be in the form as approved by the District Court of Faulkner County. Said citation shall designate the offense committed and shall require the person so charged to appear before the District Court of Faulkner County to answer the charges therein contained or present said citation at the District Court of Faulkner County Building prior to said court date for disposition. Should an arrest be required for failure to appear in response to said citation, the Animal Welfare Officer(s) shall seek the assistance of the Faulkner County Sheriff's Department to affect such arrest.

Section 10: ANIMAL BITES:

- A. When any animal has bitten, scratched or otherwise attacked a person or another domestic animal, the person or anyone having knowledge of such incident shall immediately notify Animal Welfare.
- B. Animal Welfare Officers have the authority to impound such an animal described in subsection (A) and that animal may remain in the custody of Animal Welfare until all provisions of Section 15 are met. Animals impounded under this authority shall be retained in the Animal Welfare Unit or, at the written request of the owner, at a duly licensed veterinary clinic. Owner shall have sole liability for the costs.

Section 11: QUARANTINE AFTER BITE:

A. Any animal, which has bitten a person, is a rabies suspect and the owner or custodian shall immediately release such animal for quarantine confinement in a veterinary hospital approved by the Animal Welfare Supervisor. Such quarantine may also be carried out at the Animal Welfare Unit, or if vaccination is current within the past year, within an enclosure approved by Animal Welfare on the premises of the owner at the discretion of and under the supervision of the Animal Welfare Supervisor. If the animal was At-Large at the time of the incident, quarantine will not be allowed on the premises of the owner. All quarantines shall be for a period of ten (10) days.

B. Upon the request of any person who has been bitten by a dog or other animal within the unincorporated areas of Faulkner County, Arkansas, (or by a parent or legal guardian of a person bitten who is under a disability), the Animal Welfare Officer shall take such dog or animal, or a plurality of same if they are reasonably suspected of the biting, into custody and confine and quarantine same under the provisions of subsection (A) or under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian, who shall keep such dog or animal in quarantine until he shall issue his certificate that:

1. The veterinarian has complied with the observation provisions of Section 3 of Act 11, First Extraordinary Session of the 1968 Arkansas General Assembly (Rabies Control Act; (and the dog or other animal appears to be free of infection of rabies (hydrophobia).

C. When the licensed veterinarian supervising the quarantine of any dog or other animal quarantined under subsection (A) and (B) shall issue the certificate provided for in subsection (B) (1), the owner of such dog or animal may retake custody of it upon tender to such veterinarian or the Animal Welfare Officer of their customary and reasonable fees and charges for impounding, boarding, lodging, observation and testing; except a person who is bitten by an animal while baiting, teasing, or molesting said animal or while trespassing on the premises of the owner or keeper of said animal shall pay all customary and reasonable charges and fees resulting from his request to have said animal confined and quarantined.

D. The fee for quarantining an animal at the Animal Welfare Unit shall include boarding fees, impound fees, cost of rabies vaccination and license if applicable, as designated by the Animal Welfare Unit.

E. If any dog or other animal confined under subsections (A) and (B) is not reclaimed by its owner, such dog shall be released by the veterinarian to the Animal Welfare Officer who shall treat such dog or animal as one found running at-large within the unincorporated areas of Faulkner County, Arkansas.

F. Any dog or other animal having rabies or symptoms thereof, or suspected of having rabies, or which has been exposed to rabies shall be immediately released by the

owner or custodian of such dog or animal to the Animal Welfare Officer and the Animal Welfare Officer shall confine such dog or animal in quarantine as provided for above.

Section 12: LIABILITY FOR ANIMALS THAT ATTACK A HUMAN BEING:

A person commits a Level Two Violation if he or she owns, keeps, harbors, or possesses an animal which, by the negligence of the person, attacks a person causing harm to that or any other person or exhibits vicious or ferocious behavior towards a person causing fear. Violation of this section shall constitute a Level Two Violation, and will be sanctioned pursuant to Section 16. It shall be an affirmative defense to this offense if the animal was provoked or teased.

Animal attacks which show evidence of recklessness or purposefulness on the part of the person in possession of the animal may be prosecuted under the assault and battery laws of the State.

Section 13: DISEASED OR INJURED ANIMALS:

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly keep any injured animal without providing proper treatment for such injury, or any animal infected with a disease which may contaminate other animals and which may be a health hazard. A person acts "knowingly" when he is aware that such circumstances exist.

B. Any such untreated injured animal or any diseased animal shall be immediately treated or, when necessary, humanely destroyed, to prevent unwarranted suffering. The disposition of such animals shall be at the direction of the supervisor of Animal Welfare Unit or a licensed veterinarian.

Section 14: KEEPING OF DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS DOG:

A. The keeping of such dogs shall be subject to the following standards:

1. Leash and muzzle No person shall permit a vicious or dangerous dog to go outside its kennel or pen unless such dog is securely maintained with a leash no longer than four feet in length and is muzzled by a device sufficient to prevent the dog from biting people or other animals.

2. No person shall permit a vicious or dangerous dog to be kept on a chain, rope or other type of leash outside its kennel or pen unless a person is in physical control of the leash.

3. The person in control of the animal must be of size and strength to adequately maintain control of the dog.

4. Such dogs may not be leashed to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, buildings, etc.

B. Confinement All dogs designated vicious or dangerous shall be securely confined indoors or in a securely enclosed kennel, except when leashed and muzzled as provided above. The pen, kennel or structure must have secure sides and a secure top, which is attached to the sides. The pen or kennel must have a secure bottom or floor attached to the sides of the pen or the sides of the pen must be embedded in the ground at a depth of no less than two feet. Kennels must be adequately lighted and ventilated and be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

C. Confinement indoors No dangerous or vicious dog may be kept on a porch, patio or in any part of a house or building that would allow the dog to exit on its own volition unless to a kennel as described in subsection (B) above. In addition no such animal may be kept in a building when the windows are open or when screen window or screen doors are the only obstacles preventing the dog from exiting the structure unless they exit to the proper enclosure.

D. Signs All owners, keepers or harbors of vicious or dangerous dogs within ten days of being so designated shall display in a prominent place on their premises a sign easily readable by the public, using the words "Beware of dog." In addition, a similar sign will be posted on the kennel or pen.

E. All owners, keepers or harborers of vicious or dangerous dogs must within ten (10) days notify in writing the Animal Welfare Unit of any of the following:

1. The death of the dog.
2. The removal of the dog from Faulkner County, Arkansas.
3. The new address of the owner if the owner moves within Faulkner County, Arkansas.

F. Sale or transfer of ownership Any person may sell, barter or in any other way dispose of the dog, to any person within Faulkner County, Arkansas, provided that the seller notifies the Animal Welfare Unit on the day of the sale, and that the buyer complies with all of the requirements set forth in this section.

G. Failure to comply It is unlawful for the owner or keeper of a vicious or dangerous dog registered in Faulkner County to fail to comply with the requirements set for in this section. Failure to comply shall be subject to immediate seizure and impoundment of the animal.

H. Violation of this section shall constitute a Level Two Violation, and will be sanctioned pursuant to Section 16.

I. Each day that a violation of this ordinance continues shall be deemed a separate offense. In addition to the foregoing penalties, any person who violates this section shall

pay all expense, including shelter, food, handling, veterinary care and testimony necessitated by the enforcement of this section.

Section 15: KILLING RABID, VICIOUS OR DANGEROUS ANIMALS:

- A. A law enforcement officer may kill without notice to the owner any dog, cat, or any other animal, domestic or wild if such animal is reasonably suspected of being rabid whether it bears the tag provided for or not.
- B. A law enforcement officer may kill any animal without notice to the owner if it is reasonably suspected by the officer to be a vicious or dangerous animal and is putting persons or property in immediate and unreasonable danger.

Section 16: PENALTIES:


- A. A person found guilty of a level one violation as established in this ordinance for the first time will be ordered to pay a fine of \$50 plus restitution for any damages caused by the incident. For the second offense within 12 months, a person will pay a fine of \$200 plus restitution. For a third offense or subsequent offenses within 12 months from the last, the person will pay \$500 plus restitution.
- B. A person found guilty of a level two violation as established in this ordinance for the first time will be ordered to pay a fine of \$500 plus restitution for any damages caused by the incident. For the second offense within 12 months, a person will pay a fine of \$750 plus restitution. For a third offense or subsequent offenses within 12 months from the last, the person will pay \$1000 plus restitution. Additionally, the convicting court may, in the court's discretion, order that the dog be humanely destroyed.


Section 17: ANIMAL CONTROL FUND:

The fines collected pursuant to this Ordinance will be maintained in an "animal control fund" of the County Treasury to be used in furtherance of goals of this ordinance.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS; AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS RECEIVED UNDER ACT 799 OF 2003 TO BE APPROPRIATED AND EXPENDED FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION AND FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES. 

WHEREAS, pursuant to A.C.A. § 15-41-209, fine monies deposited as special revenues in the Game Protection Fund may be expended in the form of grants for fish and wildlife conservation education and other purposes consistent with Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 35; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to A.C.A. § 15-41-209, the Arkansas Department of Education has received monies associated with the Game Protection Fund and has distributed the sum of \$8,426.61 to Faulkner County for distribution pursuant to the applicable law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF FAULKNER COUNTY, ARKANSAS, THAT:

Article 1: The sum of \$8,426.61 received from the Arkansas Department of Education and forwarded to Faulkner County shall be distributed to the below-mentioned eligible recipients for the purposes specifically set forth in A.C.A. § 6-16-1101, e.g. the study of general fish and wildlife conservation issues, hunter education training, fishing education training, boating education training, wildlife habitat development, Project WILD, and the Hooked on Fishing.

Article 2: The sum of \$8,426.61 shall be distributed as follows:

1. Conway School District	\$ 1,203.80
2. Vilonia School District	\$ 1,203.80
3. Guy-Perkins School District	\$ 1,203.80
4. Mt. Vernon-Enola School District	\$ 1,203.80
5. Greenbrier School District	\$ 1,203.80

Article 3: Severability – In the event any portion of this ordinance is declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional was not originally a part of this ordinance and the remaining portions of the ordinance shall be executed fully and faithfully.



ORDINANCE 13-25

Be it enacted by the Quorum Court of Faulkner County, State of Arkansas. An Ordinance to be entitled: An appropriation Ordinance to establish the annual operating budget for calendar year 2014.

Section 1: ANNUAL BUDGET ADOPTED BY REFERENCE.

The annual budget for calendar year 2014 identified as "2014 Annual Budget, Faulkner County, Arkansas", dated December 17, 2013 is hereby adopted by reference. A copy of said budget shall be filed in the Office of the County Clerk and shall be available for inspection and copying by any person during normal business hours.

Section 2: NONRESTRICTED EXPENDITURE CATEGORIES.

Expenditures of funds appropriated by this Ordinance shall not be restricted to the line item expenditure codes comprising the four major categories of expenditures - Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges and Capital Outlays, but shall be restricted to office/departmental expenditures.

Section 3: EXPENDITURE RESTRICTED TO SPECIFIED FUNDS.

No expenditure of appropriated funds shall be made from any fund other than the fund specified in the Ordinance or an amendment thereto.

Section 4: TRANSFERS.

Any transfer of monies between the various funds of the County or between the four major categories of expenditures - Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, Capital Outlays - shall be made only with prior approval of the Faulkner County Quorum Court. Provided, however, all transfers budgeted for in the annual budget shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

Section 5: REPEALER.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed. If any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or application of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

Section 6: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance is adopted to comply with the provisions of A.C.A. § 14-14-907 and shall be effective as of January 1, 2014.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS REGARDING THE SITING, ERECTION AND PLACEMENT OF WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS FACILITIES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Federal Government through the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has issued wireless communications licenses for cellular, personal communication services, paging and other providers of wireless antenna services; and

WHEREAS, the demand by citizens for new wireless communications services has produced an increased need for installation of wireless antennas and wireless communication facilities (WCF) to serve the public, including the citizens of Faulkner County; and

WHEREAS, WCF are supportive of the public health, safety, and welfare in that they provide useful portable communication services for personal convenience, business and emergency purposes; and

WHEREAS, additional WCF are required to provide quality communication services to meet the growing needs of the public and business for wireless communications and should be accommodated in Faulkner County; and

WHEREAS, the siting, erection and placement of WCF should be reasonably regulated to minimize potential health, safety, and aesthetic impacts on the surrounding area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF FAULKNER, STATE OF ARKANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: PURPOSE AND GOALS.

- A. Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish general guidelines for the siting, erection and placement of WCF, and to provide for a penalty for the violation of these guidelines.
- B. Goals. The goals of this Ordinance are to:
- 1) provide a range of locations for the siting, erection and placement of the WCF within Faulkner County consistent with the public health, safety and welfare and reasonable aesthetic considerations;
 - 2) encourage the location of WCF on existing structure, including utility poles, signs, water towers, buildings, and other WCF where feasible;

- 3) encourage Collocation and Site Sharing of new and existing WCF; and
- 4) protect the residents of Faulkner County from the uncontrolled development of WCF by requiring reasonable siting conditions.

Section 2: DEFINITIONS.

- A. *Antenna Array* means one or more rods, panels, discs, or similar devices used for the transmission or reception of radio frequency signals, which may include an omni directional antenna (rod), a directional antenna (panel), and a parabolic antenna (dish). The antenna Array does not include the Support Structure defined below.
- B. *Attached Wireless Communications Facility (Attached WCF)* means Antenna Array attached to an existing building or structure which shall include, but not be limited to, utility poles, signs, water towers, with any accompanying pole or device that attaches the Antenna Array to the existing building or structure and associated connection cables.
- C. *Collocation or Site Sharing* means use of a common WCF or common site by two or more wireless license holders or by one wireless license holder for more than one type of communications technology or placement of a WCF on a structure owned or operated by a utility or other public entity.
- D. *County Judge* means the duly elected Judge of the County Court of Faulkner County, Arkansas.
- E. *Equipment Facility* means any structure used to contain ancillary equipment for a WCF that includes cabinets, shelters, a build-out of an existing structure, pedestals, and other similar structures.
- F. *Height*, when referring to a WCF, means the distance measured from ground level on the highest point on the WCF, including the Antenna Array.
- G. *Setback* means the required distance from the foundation of the WCF land based elements to the property lines of the parcel on which the WCF is located.
- H. *Stealth Technology* means systems, components, and materials used in the construction of WCF which are designed to mask or conceal the WCF to make it less intrusive with respect to the surrounding property.

- I. *Support Structure* means a structure designed and constructed specifically to support an Antenna Array, and may include a monopole tower, a self-supporting (lattice), a guy-wire supported tower, or similar structures. Any device used to fasten an Attached WCF to an existing building or structure shall be excluded from the definition of and regulations applicable to Support Structures.
- J. *Wireless Communications* means any personal wireless service as defined in the Telecommunications Act of 1996, which includes FCC licensed commercial wireless Telecommunication services including: cellular, personal communication services (PCS), specialized mobile radio (SMR), enhanced specialized mobile radio (ESMR), paging, and similar services that currently exist or that may in the future be developed.
- K. *Wireless Communications Facilities (WCF)*, transmission tower/station, means any unstaffed facility for the transmission or reception of wireless telecommunications services, usually consisting of an Antenna Array, connection cables, an Equipment Facility, and a Support Structure to achieve the necessary elevation.

Section 3: APPLICABILITY.

- A. New Construction. No person, firm, or corporation shall install or construct any WCF from and after the passage of this Ordinance unless the installation, construction, and the WCF comply with the requirements of this Ordinance.
- B. Pre-existing WCF. WCF installed and constructed prior to the effective date of this ordinance shall not be required to meet the requirements of this Ordinance. WCF that replace an established, legal WCF will be subject to this Ordinance, except that setback non-conformities will be grandfathered in without the need for a variance.

Section 4: DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS.

- A. Height Standards. The following height standards shall apply to all WCF installations:
 - 1) *Attached WCF*. Attached WCF shall not add more than twenty (20) feet in height to the existing building or structure to which it is attached (Attachment Structure).
 - 2) *WCF with Support Structures*. WCF with Support Structures be limited to three hundred and twenty-five (325) feet maximum as measured from the average undisturbed soil area to the highest tower projection unless otherwise

approved by the County Judge of Faulkner County.

B. Setback Standards. The following setback standards shall apply to all WCF installations.

- 1) *Attached WCF.* Antenna Arrays for Attached WCF are exempt from the setback provisions. An attached WCF Antenna Array may extend up to thirty (30) inches horizontally beyond the edge of the Attachment Structure so long as the Antenna Array does not encroach upon the adjoining parcel.
- 2) *WCF with Support Structure.* WCF with Support Structure shall be setback at a distance equal to the tower's height from the property line or any occupiable structure. If the applicant provides a letter or design drawings stamped by a certified structural engineer documenting that the proposed structure's fall zone is less than the actual height of the structure, the setbacks may be reduced by a variance granted under Section 5 of this Ordinance.

C. Land Form Preservation. Existing mature tree growth and natural land form on the site shall be preserved to the extent feasible; provided, however, that vegetation that causes interference with the antennas or inhibits access to the Equipment facility may be trimmed or removed.

D. Aesthetics, Placement, Materials, and Colors. WCF shall be designed so as to be compatible with the existing structures and surroundings to a feasible extent, including placement in a location which is consistent with the proper functioning of the WCF, the use of compatible or neutral colors, or stealth technology.

E. Lighting and Signage. The following lighting and signage requirements shall apply to all WCF facility installations:

- 1) *Artificial Illumination.* WCF shall not be artificially illuminated, directly or indirectly, except for:
 - a. security and safety lighting or equipment buildings if such lighting is appropriately down shielded to keep light within the boundaries of the site; and
 - b. such illumination of the WCF as may be required by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) or other applicable authority installed

in a manner to minimize impacts on adjacent residences.

- 2) *Signage.* WCF shall not display any signage, logos, decals, symbols, or any message of a commercial or noncommercial nature, except for a small message containing provider identification and emergency telephone numbers and such other information as may be required by local, state, or federal regulations governing WCF.
- F. Security Fencing. WCF with Support Structures shall be enclosed by a security fence not less than six (6) feet in height. Nothing herein shall prevent security fencing which is necessary to meet requirements of State or Federal agencies.
- G. Structural Integrity. WCF with Support Structures shall be constructed to the Electronic Industries Association/Telecommunications Industries Association (EIA/TIA) 222 Revision F Standard entitled "Structural Standards for Steel Antenna Towers and Antenna Supporting Structures" (or equivalent), as it may be updated or amended. Each Support Structure shall be capable of supporting at least three antenna arrays.

Section 5: VARIANCES

- A. Plans for construction of cell towers that do not meet the requirements of this ordinance will be submitted to the County Judge along with documentation and/or plans that justify the request for variance.
- B. If the County Judge is satisfied with any one of the following, then the County Judge may grant the applicant's request for variance:
 - 1) A letter or design drawing stamped by a certified structural engineer documenting that the proposed structure's fall zone is less than the actual height of the structure.
 - 2) Waivers from all the proposed structure's surrounding neighbors stating their support for the variance.
 - 3) Documentation showing that the proposed structure is a replacement and exact copy of an older structure found at the same location.
- C. If none of the additional documents mentioned above, in part B, are provided, then the County Judge will convene the Cell Tower Committee who will then evaluate the

variance request to determine if an amendment to this ordinance is needed.

Section 6: SHARED FACILITIES AND COLLOCATION POLICY.

- A. Collocation. All WCF shall be constructed to be capable of sharing the facility with other providers, to collocate with other existing WCF, and to accommodate the future collocation of other WCF. Persons proposing to erect or construct new WCF shall demonstrate that he or she has made a reasonably good faith attempt to find a collocation site. Competitive conflict and financial burden are not deemed to be adequate reasons against collocation.

Section 7: REMOVAL OF ABANDONED WCF.

- A. Any WCF that is not operated for a continuous period of twelve (12) months shall be considered abandoned and the WCF owner shall remove the WCF within ninety (90) days after notice from the County Judge to remove the WCF. If the abandoned WCF is not removed within ninety (90) days, the County Judge may remove it and recover the costs from the WCF owner. If there are two or more users of a single WCF, this provision shall not become effective until all providers cease to use the WCF. If the owner of an abandoned WCF cannot be located or is no longer in business, the requirements of this Section shall be the responsibility of the land owner on whose property the WCF is located.

Section 8: NONCONFORMING WCF.

- A. WCF in existence on the date of the adoption of this Ordinance which do not comply with the requirements of this Ordinance (nonconforming WCF) are subject to the following provisions:
- 1) *Expansion*. Nonconforming WCF may continue in use for the purpose now used, but may not be expanded without complying with this Ordinance.
 - 2) *Additions*. Nonconforming WCF may add additional antennas (belonging to the same provider or other providers) subject to provisions of this Ordinance.
 - 3) *Repairs*. Nonconforming WCF which become damaged or destroyed due to any reason or cause, may be repaired and restored to their former use, location, and physical dimensions subject to the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 9: NOTIFICATION.

- A. No person, firm, or corporation shall install or construct any WCF unless the person, firm, or corporation has first given the County Judge at least thirty (30) days written notice of his, her, or its intention to install or construct the WCF.

Section 10: ENFORCEMENT.

- A. The enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby delegated to the County Judge. In addition to the right to seek the imposition of the penalty set forth in Section 11 hereof, the County Judge is hereby expressly authorized to seek the immediate removal of all new WCF erected or constructed in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 11: PENALTY

- A. The fine or penalty for violating any provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction in the municipal court, not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for any one specified offense or violation, or double that sum for each repetition of such offense or violation; provided, further, that if a thing prohibited or rendered unlawful is, in its nature, continuous, in respect to time, the fine or penalty for allowing the continuance thereof in violation of this Ordinance shall not exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each day that it may be unlawfully continued.

Section 12: SEVERABILITY.

- A. The various parts, sections, and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 13: EMERGENCY.

- A. Whereas the construction of WCF, placement of Attached WCF and related facilities are of concern to the citizens who are affected by such; and whereas there is increasing construction and proliferation of WCF, Attached WCF and related facilities not subject to the reasonable regulations provided herein; now, therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be and is effective from the date of its passage.

Section 14: SUPERSESSION

A. This Ordinance supersedes and repeals all prior ordinances of Faulkner County regulating WCF.


