III. SPONSOR MESSAGE	JP French with Rave Mobile Safety gave a brief overview of what Rave Mobile Safety has to offer. Bought by our state legislature, AR was the first state to deploy Smart911. Rave Mobile Safety offers a personal safety profile. This allows an individual to put in as little or as much information as they wish for the 911 dispatcher to see should a person call 911. The facilities profile allows businesses, churches, companies to create a profile with specialized building or facility information. The Panic Button for schools is another Rave Mobile Safety option. The state now has 1050 schools signed up, 4100 buildings, and over 40,000 teachers that have the Panic Button capability. Next Smart Prepare gives the county judge 2 licenses to run queries with questions such as how many bedridden individuals are in an area, how much livestock is in an area, etc. to know certain information pre-disaster in order to better prepare resources that may be needed. Rave Mobile Safety also has rapid feedback and response options in order to notify mass people or whoever you choose to notify. This program is also certified by the Department of Homeland Security.
